

The Department of Pediatrics at McMaster University and McMaster Children's Hospital is seeking an academic physician to join the Division of Pediatric Endocrinology in a newly created 1.0 GFT position. The endocrinology team currently comprises 5.2 pediatric endocrinologists and an extensive and dedicated team of allied health professionals from nursing, nutrition, social work, child life, exercise physiology, kinesiology and psychology.

The Pediatric Endocrinology Division at McMaster is an inpatient and outpatient service that functions as a tertiary care referral center for the regions of Waterloo-Wellington and Hamilton-Niagara-Haldimand-Brant (LHIN's 3 and 4) serving a community of 2.3 million people. The successful candidate will be in a position to advance divisional and departmental goals within clinical care, education and clinical and/or basic research. A relevant graduate degree at the Master's or PhD level would be an asset. The division currently divides broadly into General Endocrinology, Diabetes and the Children's Exercise and Nutrition (CENC) programs with the latter also including a pediatric lipid clinic. In conjunction with Adolescent Medicine, the past few years have also seen the addition of a rapidly expanding Gender Clinic, providing care to transgender and gender-nonconforming youth. Our pediatric endocrinology fellowship training program is accredited by the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons.

This position will incorporate an academic appointment and salary will be commensurate with the experience and expertise of the applicant. We offer a collegial atmosphere, a unique academic environment, many collaborative research opportunities and the opportunity to work in a growing academic department with enthusiastic colleagues. McMaster University is internationally recognized for innovations in medical education and pioneering biomedical, epidemiological and health systems research.

Applicants should be certified (or eligible for certification) by the Royal College of Physicians and Surgeons of Canada and have demonstrated experience and recognized training in Pediatric Endocrinology and must be licensed (or eligible for licensure) in the Province of Ontario.

All qualified candidates are encouraged to apply; however, Canadian citizens and permanent residents will be considered first for this position. To comply with the Government of Canada's reporting requirements, the University is obliged to gather information about applicants' status as either Permanent Residents of Canada or Canadian citizens. Applicants need not identify their country of origin or current citizenship; however, all applications must include one of the following statements: Yes, I am a citizen or permanent resident of Canada - or - No, I am not a citizen or permanent resident of Canada.
