- CPEG advocacy grant
 - CPEG has not received an application yet
 - Provide financial support for advocacy initiative of CPEG members to promote endocrine/metabolic health of children and youth in Canada, or globally
 - Fellows and residents are encouraged to apply
 - Amount: \$7500
 - **Deadline November 2022** (same as CPEG fellowship application deadline)

3. Treasurer's Report- Munier Nour

- Sponsorship was good \$199 985 this year
- 2021 Surplus \$173 233 (as compared to a \$52,708 surplus in 2021), largely due to increased meeting sponsorship and lower meeting expenses.
- Meeting registration fees were less this year.
- An increase in website fees in 2021, due to required website updates.
- Less cash amount in CPEG assets this year, cash has been placed into short term and long term investments.
- Prepaid portion for UofT CPD of \$5,500
- Liabilities- funds held for fellowship and SWEET funds
- Current assets: Total \$856 616, but approximately \$472 627 is held for CPEG Fellowships.
- Closing balance for 2021 is \$856, 616 (2021 opening balance was \$683,383, with a \$173,233 surplus)
- Motion to approve 2021 financial statements.

 - Vote: 64/108 members voted, 98% approve, 2% abstain
- Motion to approve to use the same accounting firm for 2022 (Villeneuve, Gagné, Stébenne, Proulx) with completion of Notice to Reader

 - Vote: 62 members voted, 95% approve, 5% abstain

- Anticipated expenses for 2022:
 - Accounting fee: \$3500 + Preparation “Notice to Reader” and \$150/y for accounting app
 - Website maintenance:

- With update, transitioned to new hosting services
 - a. From Digital Ocean to CanTrust/R-studio for website/ShinyApps
- Upgrade/Transition costs ~\$6000
 - a. On top of usual ~\$5000/year website operating costs
- Thank you to Dan Metzger for his work with the CPEG website
- Budget predictions:
 - Sponsorship – decision to convert to virtual made following establishment of sponsorship decisions
 - Sponsorship much more successful in the past 2 years
 - Cost of meeting substantially lower
 - Thank you to the UofT CPD team
 - CPEG membership fees were increased to \$80 in 2020. No plan to increase at this point.
 - Surplus funds 2022 expected to be similar to 2021

- CPEG 2022 Conference registration:
 - Highest registration ever- 183 registrants (excluding industry)
 - Shortened virtual conference of 2 days, same as 2021 meeting
 - a. 3 symposia instead of 4, but still included debate, oral abstracts and posters. Also, each poster had a 2-3 min pre-recorded video presentation
 - Sponsorship was excellent this year. Satellite symposia included for the Platinum and Gold sponsors.
 - New – fellows’ symposium restarted
 - New – Lunch networking
 - New- virtual social event Thursday evening
- Abstract criteria:
 - Any CPEG member can submit an abstract (limit of 2 per first author)
 - All medical trainees (e.g. medical students, pediatrics residents, and non-Canadian-based Pediatric Endocrinology Fellows/Subspecialty Residents) who wish to submit an abstract to the CPEG Scientific Meeting, must first apply to be a CPEG Associate member (free).
 - Canadian-based Endocrine Fellows and Subspecialty Residents are not required to have a CPEG full Active Member as a co-author or supervisor on their submitted abstract.
 - For other trainees, at least one of the abstract co-author(s) must be a full CPEG Active member in good standing.
- Poster abstracts are open to all, but oral abstracts are only open to trainees (all types), or those who are in their first year of training
- John Bailey award (\$500) will be given for the best oral abstract, and only those who are Canadian-based Endocrine Fellows and Subspecialty Residents are eligible for this award
 - New this year, role of trainee in project was requested in submission

- Planning and partnership development for a national intervention to prevent ketoacidosis (DKA) in children at diabetes diagnosis.

 - Work to date- reviewed existing interventions, identified audiences and behaviours to be addressed, behaviour theory framework. Publication Koripalli et al. *Pediatr Diabetes* Jan 2022
 - Next steps: engage with stakeholders (education system, adolescent/caregiver, healthcare providers), CIHR planning and dissemination grant application, funding application and implementation and evaluation of implementation.
- CPSP study: Symptomatic hypoglycemia during treatment of Acute Lymphoblastic Leukemia — Mary Jiang (fellow)
 - A cross Canada study with the Canadian Pediatric Surveillance Program to assess incidence of hypoglycemia during ALL treatment particularly with 6-MP and asparaginase and look at treatments considered for these children
 - Great engagement and collaborations from the CPEG members

- CPSP study: ONH National Surveillance — Supraja Rengan (fellow). PIs Dr. Brandy Wicklow & Shahzan Amed,
 - Description: A **one-year** surveillance study developed in collaboration with CPSP to report new cases of optic nerve hypoplasia (ONH) and septo-optic dysplasia (SOD) in Canadian children. Data captured will include patient clinical characteristics, age at diagnosis, evidence and timing of associated pituitary hormone dysfunction (PHD) and clinical and biochemical testing relevant to the diagnosis and associated features. The aim of this study is to identify the minimum incidence of ONH and SOD at a national level, and to describe the clinical phenotype of those children. This information will be used to inform future screening and follow up guidelines to improve the care of these children.
 - Please report your cases, surveillance ends November 2022
